Introduction

Benjamin Mkapa foundation in collaboration with Tanzania Network of Women Living with HIV and AIDS (TNW+) has implemented a Combined Prevention Campaign (CPC) for general population in seven wards of Masasi TC as Mkuti, Napupa, Matawale, Jida, Sululu, Mwengemtapika and Nyasa wards. As the main goal of the campaign remaining as to reduce HIV transmission among general population in Masasi Town Council through Combination Prevention Campaign (CPC), providing referral linkage to tested clients during the campaigns using community health volunteers in their respective villages and wards. The campaign is expected to reach all fourteen (14) wards of Masasi Town council.

Local Government Authorities of districts (Village Executive Officer (VEO) and Mtaa Executive Officer (MEO) from respective wards in collaboration with CHAC, DAC, RAC, RMO, DMO and CHW/CBHS participated from the beginning to the end of the campaign effectively being one of the strategy for project implementation.

Different services were provided in each of the ward visited and among the services that were provided includes HIV testing (onsite and outreaches), TB screening, Brest and Cervical Cancer screening, provision of family planning services, Condom distribution, Community Health Insurance (CHF) services, Gender based Violence (GBV) education and services including Violence against women (VAW) education. Two models in HIV testing were delivered one as outreach testing services and other being that client visits the established sites (onsite) in each wards under consultation of CHAC and Local Government Authorities in a specific ward.

Population that met the age requirements were directly eligible for HIV testing and for children, parent or guardian consent was offered for providing HIV testing services. Outreach locations were such as on street corners, outside bars, bodaboda parks, and door to door. Also, male condoms were distributed to community members that tested and demanded condom voluntarily after HIV testing for protection. Data collection forms provided to health providers as to collect client's information about demographic and HIV testing history. Also, no client information was revealed without client's consent hence confidentiality was highly maintained.

During outreaches also an index testing was performed in all wards as to break the chain of HIV transmission by offering HIV testing services to person who has exposed to HIV and link them by early diagnosis and treatment.

Findings Summary (Include activity pictures)

The campaign reached a number of people who had not been previously tested for HIV and a number of people who had not tested in the past years.

During implementation, it indicates that large number of people living with HIV belongs to Women with greater than 45 years old, meaning that women living with HIV are many as compared to number of men.

Local Government Authority leaders shown full cooperation on the implementation of the CPC in their respective areas

Challenges Encountered

1. Tanzania Network of Women Living with HIV and AIDS (TNW+) as an implementing partner is not involved in any of the planning and designing of the program activities.
2. Though we have reached the target number to be tested, it seems that many areas were not covered especially for the outreach services since there were few number of team for outreach services.

Recommendations

1. Additional of the number of health workers team for testing during outreach services as to expand the coverage of the services around the respective ward.
2. Tanzania Network of Women Living with HIV and AIDS (TNW+) should be involved during activity planning so as build and strengthen the capacity of TNW+ and to create the sense of project ownership among partners.

Way Forward

A total of 15254 people were tested during CPC in community settings in this round, and 157 people were identified as living with HIV and AIDS. After the CPC in these seven wards community health workers in their respective wards will continue with the post CPC follow up activities under supervision of Tanzania Network of women Living with HIV and AIDS (TNW+), link clients to HIV care and Treatment services and retain on medication the lost to follow up clients for four months and the CPC will be continuing in other wards of Masasi Town Council.
